This Weekend

For the third-straight year Kansas volleyball will open its season on the road traveling to Richmond, Va., to kick off its 2008 campaign in the VCU Invitational, Aug. 29-30, with Virginia Commonwealth and North Carolina State.

Quick Hits

- » Kansas returns five starters plus its libero from 2007.
- » KU has never lost a season opener under head coach Ray Bechard.
- » The Jayhawks are a combined 3-0 against VCU and NC State under Bechard.
- » KU went 7-3 last season in non-Big 12 matches.
- » Kansas is 16-10 all-time in matches played in August, and 12-4 under Bechard.

Scouting the Opponents

VCU returns five starters and its libero to a squad which went 12-21 in 2007, including a 6-8 (8th) Colonial Athletic Association record. Sophomore Ariel Newman is back after leading the Rams with 3.09 kpg a year ago, along with sophomore Jessica Ojukwu who was third in the CAA with a .289 hitting efficiency. Senior Laryssa Goncalves also returns to the court as the team's libero after ranking third in the conference last season with 5.18 dpg. The Rams are coached by James Finley, who owns a 50-51 overall record at the school as he enters his fourth season.

After winning just three games in 2007, NC State enters the 2008 season with a young squad of six upperclassmen and 11 freshmen and sophomores. Of the Wolfpack's nine letterwinners, five were starters a year ago. Junior Chrissy Zirpolo is the team's top returning offensive threat having averaged 2.23 kpg in 2007. Sophomore Lindsay Benac will most likely receive the starting nod at libero once again after digging up 2.89 balls per game. Charita Stubbs owns a 5-58 overall record in three years as head coach of the Pack.

Series History

Kansas holds a 2-0 advantage in the all-time series with VCU. The Jayhawks have notched 3-0 sweeps in both meetings - Sept. 1, 2001 and Sept. 9, 2005. KU is 3-3 against teams from the Colonial Athletic Association.

The series between the Jayhawks and the Wolfpack is locked at one win a piece with KU getting a 3-0 win in the teams' last meeting in Raleigh, N.C., on Oct. 13, 2001. KU and NC State first met in College Station, Texas, on Oct. 12, 1990, in a 3-0 Wolfpack victory. Kansas is 6-6 against current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Last Time Out

Fans got to see a preview of the 2008 Kansas volleyball team on Aug. 23 as the Jayhawks took on KU alumni in a scrimmage at the Horejsi Family Athletics Center. Kansas swept the alumni 3-0 (25-20, 25-18, 25-23). Sophomore outside hitter Karina Garlington led all players with 11 kills. Junior Brittany Williams and freshman Allison Mayfield each contributed nine kills. In the back court, sophomore libero Melissa Manda secured the defense digging up 10 balls.

Perfect 10

The Jayhawks are a perfect 10-0 in season openers under head coach Ray Bechard. Since its inaugural season in 1975, Kansas has gone 21-12 in its first match of the year.

Who's Back

Eleven letterwinners return to the 2008 Kansas volleyball squad, including six starters from a year ago. The Jayhawks' top offensive threat is back in outside hitter sophomore **Jenna Kaiser**, who led the team with 2.86 kpg in 2007. Also returning to the front row are senior middle blockers **Natalie Uhart** (1.17 bpg, 2.41 kpg) and **Savannah Noyes** (.235 pct, 1.97 kpg), along with outside sophomore hitter **Karina Garlington** (2.00 kpg, 1.83 dpg). Back to run the offense is the team's setter, redshirt junior **Katie Martincich**. Martincich was second on the team in 2007 with 5.15 apg in a duel-setter system.

In the back court, **Melissa Manda**, who played in all 113 games in 2007 as the team's libero, is back for her sophomore campaign after leading KU with 3.97 dpg last year, seventh among Big 12 Conference players.

New Faces

Kansas volleyball picked up four talented freshmen in 2008. **Lauren Hagan** (6-1, Whitesville, Ky.), **Allison Mayfield** (6-1, Overland Park, Kan.) and **Corrinne Stringer** (6-0, Topeka, Kan.) are listed as outside hitters, while **Nicole Tate** (5-10, St. Louis, Mo.) will add depth at the setter position.

Important Rule Changes For 2008

Terminology - The term "game" will be changed to "set". A match still consists of the best three out of five sets.

Points Required to Win a Set - Instead of 30 points, the number of points needed to win sets one through four is now 25 (and a two-point lead). Fifteen points (and a two-point

lead) is still the requirement to win the fifth (deciding) set.

Substitutions - Each team is now allowed a maximum of 12 substitutions per set.

Points of Emphasis

Ball Handling Decisions - In recent years, referee training has emphasized focusing on the player's contact point with the ball, and not allowing outside influences, such as spin after release, to influence ball handling decisions. A 2008 point of emphasis regarding the second team contact now instructs referees to only call multiple contacts that are obvious enough to be readily seen, and to be less severe when judging extremely athletic plays.

Uhart Named To Preseason All-Big 12 Team

Kansas volleyball senior middle blocker Natalie Uhart was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's coaches. Uhart, one of just 17 players named to the team, led the Jayhawks with 1.17 bpg and a .271 attack percentage last year, while adding 2.49 kpg in 20 starts. The 6-foot-1 front row power also had eight games of 10 kills or more and blocked over four balls 11 times throughout the season.

Big 12 Gets National Attention In Preseason Poll

On Aug. 19 it was revealed that five of KU's 19 opponents are ranked in the CBS College Sports Network/AVCA Preseason Poll and three more are receiving votes. Of those teams, only one is a non-Big 12 member.

The award, which was initiated in the 1992-93 academic year, honors collegiate and high school volleyball teams that display excellence in the classroom during the school year by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team grade-point average on a 4.0 scale or a 4.10 cumulative team GPA on a 5.0 scale.

Martincich Named Big 12 Sportsperon of the Year

Kansas' Katie Martincich and Baylor's Mamadou Diene were named the 2007-08 Big 12 Sportsperons of the Year. The Sportsperons of the Year Award was started in 2000-01 to annually recognize student-athletes who displayed an extraordinary degree of sportsmanship and/or community service during the academic year.

Martincich becomes the second KU student-athlete in as many years to receive the honor (Amanda Costner, women's golf, 2007). The Jayhawks' setter has been involved in numerous KU student-athletes' community outreach projects and is responsible for organizing the inaugural Jayhawk SAAC sponsored Special Olympics Bowling Challenge, held on May 4 in Lawrence. Martincich met with the owners of a local bowling alley and convinced them to donate use of the entire facility and game room for the event. More than 100 Special Olympians and 100 KU student-athletes participated.
